Board Election and Consolidation

During the Annual Meeting, members will elect three Board members and vote on the Articles of Consolidation and the Consolidation Agreement (with Kaw Valley Electric Cooperative). Each year, three of our nine districts elect a Board member (see

LJEC District Map on page 16-B).

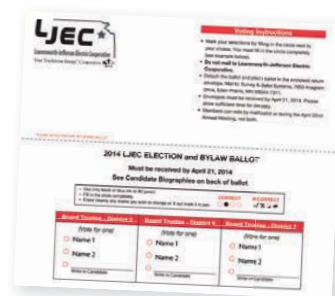
LJEC is governed by the policies set by our Board of Trustees, who are also cooperative members. Our Board provides a vital connection with our membership and the community at large.

Vote at the Annual Meeting

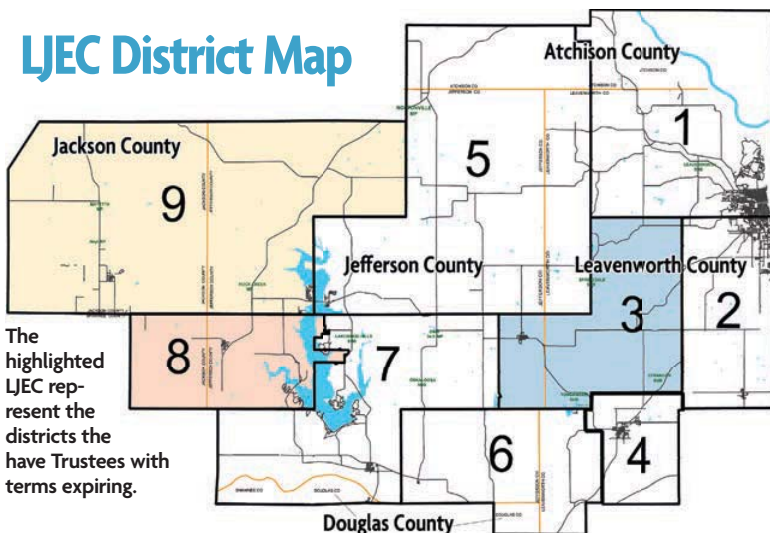

Vote by Mail

The Leavenworth-Jefferson Electric Cooperative Board of Directors is tasked with decisions that will affect the cooperative's ability to provide our members with safe,

reliable and affordable power. It is our responsibility to make sound decisions that will not only benefit members now but also in the future. It is also our responsibility to look at all avenues and possibilities when it comes to saving money, and we have been doing just that in recent years. Now is the time to look at the bigger picture, and consolidation with Kaw Valley Electric Cooperative in Topeka.

I wanted to take a moment to let each of our members know that these decisions to form the cooperative alliance and the proposed consolidation were carefully and thoughtfully evaluated by both boards, who did their

due diligence to determine if this step was the right one for our members.

Both boards unanimously determined that this was the next step toward cost savings, stabilization of rates and the future of our cooperatives.

The proposed consolidation you'll be voting on would provide us with not only significant savings over the next 10 years, it would also provide additional opportunities, resources and elevated service for both cooperatives.

It is important to note that the level of service you have come to expect from LJEC will continue. The office in McLouth will remain open, as will the Kaw Valley office in Topeka, so that we can maintain our level of customer service you all deserve. The alliance we have been working under since October 2014 has allowed us to become more efficient and specialized. The billing functions have begun to transition to the McLouth office, which will provide a boost in business for the Bank of McLouth and

the U.S. Post Office. The decision to move billing to McLouth was made as a commitment to the community. While billing transitions to McLouth, the calling center will transition to Topeka.

Although your electric bill will not decrease as a result of the consolidation, it will help ensure that your rate will not increase in the immediate future. The proposed consolidation will allow us to delay cost of service studies that could lead to rate increases. We are confident that we can keep rates stabilized for the next three, possibly five, years.

I am supporting the proposed consolidation vote by voting "yes" on April 19 because it means stabilizing rates and improving the foundation of our future electric cooperative.

Thank you for your time. I look forward to seeing you at our Annual Meeting on April 19.

As Treasurer of Leavenworth-Jefferson Electric Cooperative, it is my responsibility to oversee all funds, securities and financial activity of the cooperative.

The Board of Trustees commissioned the services of Kevin S. Kelso, CPA, P.C., P.A., Mission, to make a full and complete audit of the accounts, books and financial condition of the

cooperative.

The audit covered the cooperative's 2015 fiscal year, which began on the first day of January and ended on the 31st day of December. The audit examined the cooperative's accounting records and procedures to verify that they are accurate and in compliance with accepted standards. The auditors also examined the cooperative's system of internal control including segregation of functional responsibilities, system of authorizations and procedures that

provide control over the assets and liabilities.

Comparative balance sheets for 2014 and 2015, together with a five-year comparative operating statement, will be available in the annual meeting booklet for your information and review.

In conclusion, I am pleased to report that 2015 was another successful year for the cooperative. LJEC continues to maintain a strong and viable financial position.
