Lecompton UMC – \$1,500

In addition to providing food and clothing to those in need, the church also back-to-school supplies that help children have all of the tools they need and to feel like they belong and don't feel left out or different if they are not able to have new supplies or items needed for their classes. Everyone is still struggling to provide for their families. If this is something we can offer them, we feel this is very important. The backpacks and all supplies are new.

The church pantry is 100% funded by donations and serves the Perry-Lecompton school district that includes Douglas County, Jefferson County, and part of Shawnee county.

God's Storehouse, Meriden – \$3,000

In addition to providing food to those in need, the pantry needs to repair a hole in the floor to keep the building secure. In addition, the pantry needs to replace a freezer and refrigerator that will continue to allow the pantry to offer milk and perishable items when available.

Silver Lake Fire Dept. – \$15,500

The department needs assistance to purchase a Lifepak device. The Lifepak device can perform a variety of medical assessments an EMT cannot perform in the field. The device is a hands-free device that allows an EMT to perform lifesaving treatments as the Lifepak progresses through assessments. The department does have two advanced EMTs on staff with at least one on shift each day. The Lifepak will help elevate care in rural Shawnee County.
