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**IRRIGATION SERVICE – LOAD CONTROL**

**APPLICABILITY**

This schedule is applicable to single or three phase service of a single character supplied at one point of delivery used for irrigation pump motors, where the customer is willing to allow complete interruption of service during interruption periods for the months of June, July, August and the following month of September. initiated by the Cooperative initiated by the Cooperative. The customer must elect to participate in this load control program no later than April 15 of the current year and must agree to remain on the program until May 31 of the following year.

**CHARACTER OF SERVICE**

Single or three phase, alternating current, approximately 60 Hertz at available voltages.

**MONTHLY RATE**

Customer Charge	\$43.50 per month effective January 2025 through December 2025 \$48.50 per month effective January 2026 through December 2026 \$53.50 per month effective January 2027 through December 2027 \$58.50 per month effective January 2028
Energy Charge	13.081¢ per kWh effective January 2025 through December 2025 12.685¢ per kWh effective January 2026 through December 2026 12.302¢ per kWh effective January 2027 through December 2027 11.933¢ per kWh effective January 2028

**MINIMUM MONTHLY CHARGE**

The minimum monthly charge shall be the Customer Charge.

**POWER COST ADJUSTMENT**

The above rate will be increased or decreased in accordance with Schedule PCA-25, as it currently exists or may be amended.

**POWER FACTOR ADJUSTMENT**

The Company may determine, by permanent measurement or by test of not less than 30 minutes duration under conditions which the Company determines to be normal, the power factor of a customer. If the power factor at any delivery point is less than 95 percent, Company at its sole discretion may require Customer to install power factor correction equipment at Customer's expense.

**CONDITIONS OF SERVICE**

1. Motors having a rated capacity in excess of ten horsepower (10 HP) must be three phase, unless soft start or written pole motors approved by the Cooperative
2. For all existing services, the anniversary date under this schedule will be June 1 of each year. The customer must agree to remain on this schedule until the following May 31.
3. If the customer manually reconnects power at the service during the interruption period initiated by the Cooperative, the customer shall be reclassified and billed under schedule 40.
4. Service hereunder is subject to the Cooperative's Rules and Regulations as approved by the Cooperative's Board of Trustees.
