
PRIVATE STREET AND AREA LIGHTING SERVICE

APPLICABILITY

This schedule is applicable to single phase service of a single character used for outdoor lighting service to individual customers in areas where service can be supplied from existing facilities of the Cooperative.

EQUIPMENT AND SERVICE PROVIDED

The Cooperative will install, own, and operate the following items designated as standard or optional equipment as stated in the Cooperative's current Construction and Service Standards:

1. Light fixture.
 - a. Standard security light consisting of a lamp style fixture nominally rated at 7,000-9,500 lumens, are available for all rate class accounts.
 - b. Optional security light consisting of a lamp style or directional style fixture nominally rated at greater than 9,500 lumens, are available for non-residential rate class accounts.
2. Supported by a bracket;
3. Affixed to an existing or new wood pole not to exceed 40 feet in height, and;
4. A maximum of 125 feet of overhead or underground circuit to provide service at a customer designated location.

MONTHLY RATE

Customer will pay Cooperative for such equipment and service at the following monthly rate: \$13.50 per light per month.

POWER COST ADJUSTMENT

The above rate will be increased or decreased in accordance with Schedule PCA-25, as it currently exists or may be amended.

TERMS OF CONTRACT

Service under this schedule for a security light fixture attached to an existing wood pole will be for a minimum of one year.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. The Cooperative will determine the installed fixture on the basis of quality, capital and maintenance costs, long term availability, general customer acceptance, and other factors.
2. All optional fixture installations will be installed at the Cooperative's discretion.
3. Lamps will be operated by a photo-electric control to provide service from approximately one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise, for a total of approximately 4,000 lighting hours per year.
4. Customer assumes the responsibility for notifying the Cooperative when fixtures are inoperative.
5. Replacement of lamps due to ordinary burnout will be made at the Cooperative's expense. Replacement due to breakage for any reason may be charged to the Customer at the Cooperative's actual cost.
6. Customer will provide or secure all necessary right-of-way permits and/or easement needed to provide service under this schedule.
7. The Cooperative may refuse to install or may remove from service upon two days written notice to the Customer, any fixture provided for herein if, in the Cooperative's judgement, such fixture or its operation could cause an unsatisfactory condition affecting the quality of life in the immediate area, or the public safety, or could be in violation of any local ordinance or development restriction.

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

Service hereunder is subject to the Cooperative's Rules and Regulations as approved by the Cooperative's Board of Trustees.

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
